Official controls on the import of products of non-animal origin

Overview of legislative framework under Regulation (EU) 2017/625

Summary

Council Regulation (EU) 2017/625 on official controls and other official activities as amended by Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/478 and Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/2127 set down the general provisions for official controls on animals and goods entering the Union. These provisions are supplemented by a series of Implementing and Delegated Regulations These provisions are also supplemented by more specific legislation where increased controls, emergency measures and suspension from entry into the EU are required to manage the risks posed.

A summary of the legislative framework for official controls on products of non-animal origin (PONAO) is outlined below.

All PONAO are subject to routine import control in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2017/625, Title II Chapter V Sections I. PONAO subject to mandatory import controls fall under Article 47(1) (d), (e) and (f) and are subject to temporary increased controls, emergency measures or suspension of entry into the EU, Title II Chapter V Section II and relevant Implementing and Delegated Regulations as outlined below. Action in the event of suspicion of non-compliance and non-compliance of animals and goods entering the Union are set out in Title II Chapter V Section III of Regulation (EU) 2017/625.

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793 as amended by Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/625, Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1540 and Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/608 lays down in:

- (a) Annex I the list of food of non-animal origin from certain third countries subject to a temporary increase of official controls at their entry into the EU falling within the CN Codes and TARIC classifications laid down in that Annex, in accordance with Article 47(2)(b) of Regulation (EU) 2017/625;
- (b) Annex II the special conditions governing the entry into the EU of the certain categories of food due to the risk of contamination by mycotoxins, including aflatoxins, pesticide residues, pentachlorophenol and dioxins and microbiological contamination
- (c) Annex IIa Food from certain third countries subject to suspension of entry into the Union referred to in Article 11a
