Other Zoonoses in Humans 2018

Trichinosis (Trichinellosis)

No cases of trichinosis were notified in Ireland for 2018. No cases of trichinosis were notified in 2017.

Yersinosis

No data on the prevalence of yersinosis in humans was available for 2018. For 2017, the most recent data available, 6 cases of yersiniosis were notified giving a crude incidence rate of 0.1 per 100,000 population.

Q Fever

No cases of Q fever were reported in Ireland in 2018. In 2017, two cases of Q fever were reported in Ireland in 2017.

Echinococcosis

Two cases of echinococcosis were reported in Ireland in 2018. No cases of echinococcosis were notified in 2017.
