Some PEHO offices were using the notifications list to identify establishments for supervision and to facilitate checks in food supplement establishments regarding label notifications. However, three PEHO offices were not reviewing the information provided to facilitate official controls.	FSAI response: The FSAI will review the reasons for the inaccuracies in the food supplement notification lists and instigate a project in 2014 to resolve any problems in the electronic systems and processes used within the FSAI. EHS response: Once the FSAI has resolved the inaccuracies in the food supplements notifications list, it will circulate the list for the purpose of advising the EHS of potential food business operators.		Information on food supplements notified to the FSAI is now provided to EHOs on request as the current supplements database is not suitable for producing general reports.
