**FOOD SAFETY AUTHORITY OF IRELAND ACT, 1998  
CLOSURE ORDER**

**To:** Ontrac Service Station Limited

I, [REDACTED], being an authorised officer of the **Health Service Executive** under the Food Safety Authority of Ireland Act, 1998 (“the Act”), and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 53 of the Act, hereby direct that the premises identified in Part 1 of the Schedule be closed with immediate effect until the earliest of: -

- (i) an Order to contrary effect by a Court of competent jurisdiction; or
- (ii) further written direction by the **Health Service Executive**.

I make this order being of the opinion that there is or is likely to be a grave and immediate danger to public health at, in or on the said premises for the particular reasons set out in Part 2 of the Schedule.

**Schedule**

**Part 1 Premises**

The premises occupied by **Mr. Conor Carton, Ontrac Service Station Limited at Clonhenritt, Camolin, Co. Wexford and name trading as Cartons Daybreak**

*This closure order requires:*

*All of the premises be closed*

**Part 2 Particular reasons for making of Order**

*Regulation (EC) 852/2004 on the Hygiene of Foodstuffs  
Annex II, Chapter IX, (3)*

***Evidence of non-compliance:***

- 1. There was prolific evidence of mouse droppings observed on the floor areas in the dry goods store, the kitchen area, the deli area on the shop floor, on the shelving and on boxes in the store area and in the press underneath the wash hand basin in the staff sanitary accommodation area.**
- 2. There was evidence of gnawing to the packaging of two large packets of "[REDACTED]" in an open cardboard box in the store area. Pieces of gnawed "[REDACTED]" packaging and pieces of "[REDACTED]" were observed amongst mouse droppings in the base of this box.**

**All of the above non-compliances presented a grave and immediate danger to public health and the risk of contamination of foods with pathogenic bacteria and foreign matter. These non-compliances were likely to render food unfit for human consumption, injurious to health or contaminated in such a way that it would be unreasonable to expect it to be consumed in that state.**

***Note: Under Section 53(5) of the Food Safety Authority of Ireland Act, 1998, a person who is aggrieved by a Closure Order may, within the period of seven days beginning on the day on which the Closure Order is served on him or her, appeal against the Order to a Judge of the District Court in the District Court District in which the Order was served. Under Section 53(6) of the Food Safety Authority of Ireland Act, 1998 a person who appeals against a closure order or who applies for a direction suspending the application of the closure order under subsection (4) shall at the same time notify the Authority or official agency of the appeal or the application and the grounds for the appeal or the application and the Authority or official agency shall be entitled to appear, be heard and adduce evidence on the hearing of the appeal or the application.***
