**PROHIBITION ORDER**

To: The Company Secretary

I, [REDACTED], being an authorised officer of the **Health Service Executive** under the Food Safety Authority of Ireland Act, 1998 (“the Act”), and S. I. No. 117 of 2010, and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 20 of S. I No. 117 of 2010, hereby direct that the ***all foods manufactured on the 21st and 22nd March 2019*** identified in Part 1 of the Schedule be withdrawn from sale with immediate effect.

I make this order being of the opinion that there is a non-compliance with food legislation as outlined in part 2 of the Schedule and that the food identified in Part 1 of the Schedule should be withdrawn, as directed below

I direct Gourmet Tart Company Ltd to ensure that the food is recalled from sale or distribution in accordance with (ii)

(i)	(is not used for human consumption)

(ii)	(is recalled from sale or distribution (whether or not the food is on sale or being or has been distributed for sale in the State or elsewhere
(iii)	(is rendered safe for human consumption or is detained or is destroyed in a manner prescribed by me)

Part 2	<p>The products were manufactured in a premises where there was found to be an unacceptable risk of cross contamination of foodstuffs likely to render the food unfit for human consumption, injurious to health or contaminated in such a way that would be unreasonable to expect it to be consumed in that state.</p> <p>The premises was found to be breach of Regulation (EC) No.852/2004 on the hygiene of foodstuffs and failed to comply with the provisions of Regulations (EC) No 178/2002.</p>
